

Help for Individuals with Limited Income & Resources

- Beneficiaries with limited income and resources should be encouraged to apply to their state Medicaid office to determine eligibility for various programs.
 - Applying for Extra Help through SSA will send your information to Medicaid: **ssa.gov/medicare/part-d-extra-help**
- Beneficiaries may qualify for help from the state to pay the Medicare Part A (if any) and Part B premium, the Part A and Part B deductibles and cost sharing, and/or some Part D prescription drug costs.
- For Medicaid ONLY, you can apply online through Georgia Gateway: **gateway.ga.gov**
- The State Health Insurance Assistance Program (SHIP) provides local, in-depth, and objective insurance counseling and assistance to Medicare-eligible individuals, their families, and caregivers: **shiphelp.org**.
- Part D prescription drug savings may be available through goodrx.com and goodpill.org.

- Beneficiaries may qualify for help through these programs:
 - **Medicaid** - For help with health care costs. Apply to the state Medicaid office.
 - Primary: (404) 657-5468. Toll Free: (877) 423-4746
 - **Medicare Savings Program & Part D low-income subsidy** - For help paying Medicare Part and/or Part B premiums. In some cases, there is assistance for deductibles and coinsurance/copayments. Apply to the state Medicaid office or Social Security Administration (SSA) at your local office or apply online at ssa.gov/medicare/part-d-extra-help
 - **Supplemental Security Income (SSI) benefits** - For help with cash for basic needs. Apply to state Medicaid office or through ssa.gov/ssi
